Public health nurses are members of a family health team which can provide a wide range of free health services. Their role is to ensure the health and wellbeing of children, young people and their family / whanau, organise and deliver immunization programmes in schools and follow-up children/young people with identified health problems.

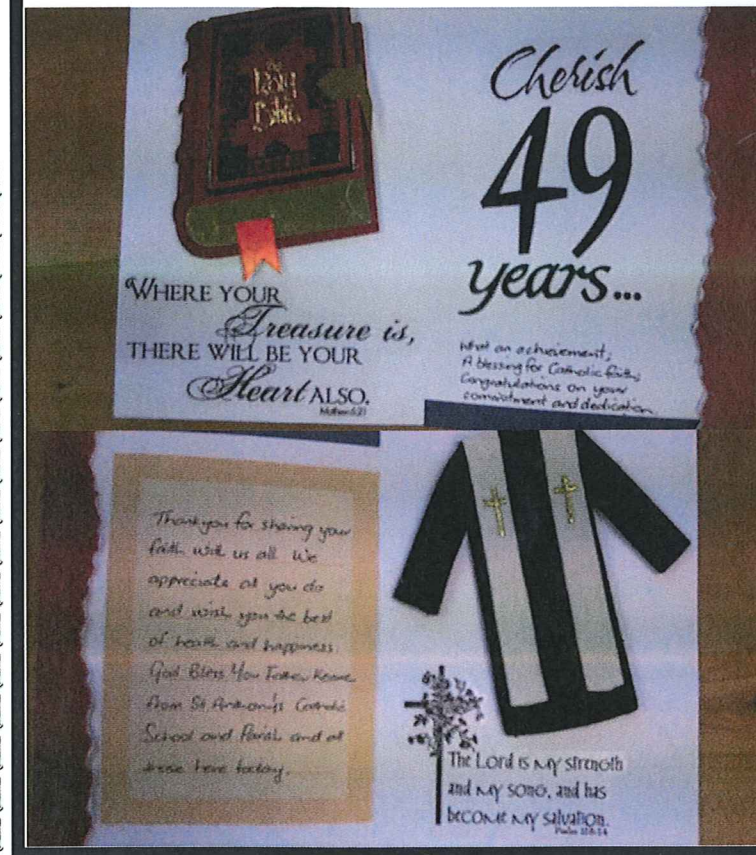
