

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

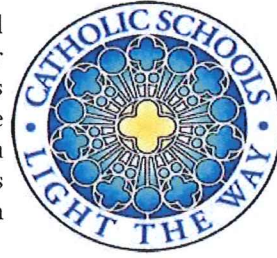

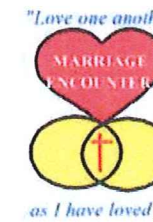

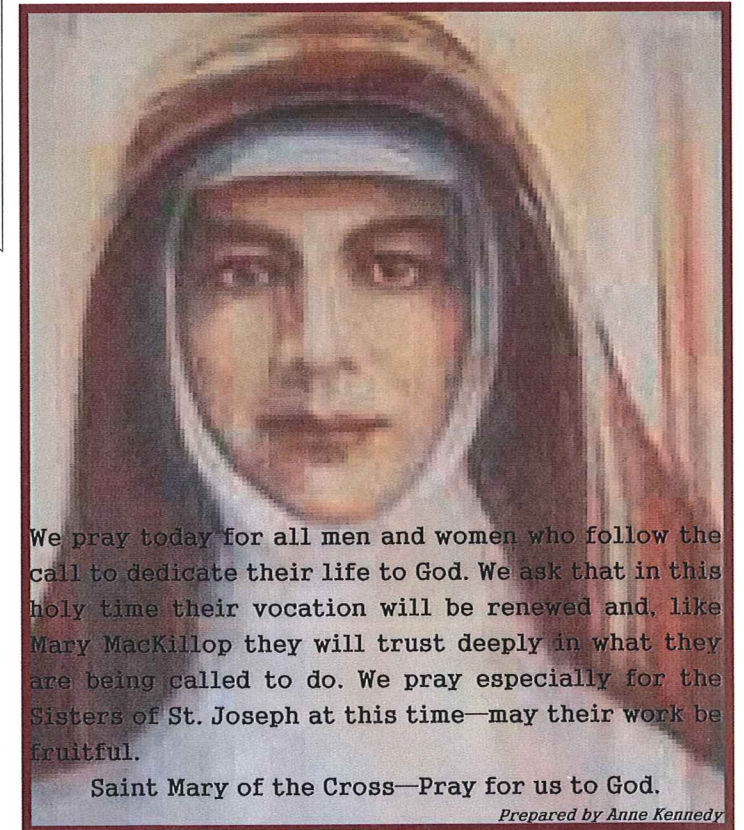
